Known as a dynamic change leader with a deep customer and provider focus, Melissa brings a broad skill set spanning P&L leadership, corporate strategy, product development, sales, technology, and operations. Her ability to lead with both vision and execution has consistently delivered measurable results and improved outcomes for organizations, clients, and the communities they serve.

Prior to joining Progyny, Melissa served as Executive Vice President and Chief Customer Officer at Blue Cross and Blue Shield of RI (BCBSRI) where she led record growth, retention and brand recognition for this \$2 billion plan across both commercial and government segments. Melissa led the evolution of the firm's retail strategy, along with a number of market-leading customer service capabilities – including the first-of-its-kind navigation and advocacy solution – and directed sales, product, marketing, operations, and enterprise strategic planning.

Before joining BCBSRI, Melissa also held senior leadership positions at Aetna (now CVS Health) and CIGNA in business operations, product development and management, underwriting, and sales.

Melissa holds a BA from the College of the Holy Cross and an MBA in Health Care Management from the University of Connecticut School of Business. She is deeply involved with the American Heart Association, serving as past board chair for the Southern New England Board of Directors, and a former Go Red chairperson. Robert M. Giglietti '92

Group Vice President, Chief Accounting Officer, Controller & Treasurer – GE Aerospace & CEO GE Corporate Holdings

GE Aerospace

Rob Giglietti is Group Vice President, Chief Accounting Officer, Controller & Treasurer for GE Aerospace and CEO of GE Corporate Holdings. In this role, Rob is responsible for GE Aerospace's controllership organization, capital structure, liability management, treasury operations, and pension; and as CEO of GE Corporate Holdings, he oversees the management of a \$50B financial services business and key legacy activities related to the 2022-04 spin-offs.

Rob was the operational leader of GE's transformation from an industrial conglomerate founded in 1892 into three standalone industry-leading public companies from 2022 to early 2024. He led the successful execution of the separations which has generated an over 400% increase in value since the original announcement. In coordination with the GE leadership team, he implemented the separations across all three businesses and corporate functions through a set of strategic and operational imperatives.

Rob also served as the CFO, GE Capital and GE Corporate from 2021 to early 2024 where he was responsible for the financial services businesses of GE as well as GE Corporate's finance and operations. He helped lead the sale of its \$35B aircraft leasing business and the wind-down of its \$18B factoring business, working closely with GE's Insurance and Energy Financial Service businesses. He also supported numerous large-scale disposals which allowed for over a \$100B reduction in debt to help facilitate the separations.

Rob has served in many leadership roles in GE Finance including in Treasury where he helped execute the sell-down of GE Capital. This initiative included transacting the sale of \$400B of assets and reduction of over \$250B of debt through numerous complex capital market transactions. He also held finance roles in GE Capital and across GE's industrial businesses and GE Corporate.

Rob's charitable efforts focus on youth development through direct education, providing safe homes and leadership programs to help create a more equitable future. He has participated on the boards of Junior Achievement of Southwest CT and Habitat for Humanity of Coastal Fairfield County. He currently serves on the board of BuildOn New York, helping to promote the continued advancement of youth through service and education in New York City and Connecticut, as well as supporting the mobilization of communities in low-income countries to build schools.

Rob graduated from UConn in 1992 with a degree in accounting and began his career at PwC. As a first-generation college graduate, Rob is a passionate advocate for higher education, contributing time and resources to UConn by establishing academic scholarships, funding student venture initiatives, mentoring students, and driving GE partnerships to support academic and professional development for students.

Rob is from a UConn Family -- his brother, Mike, sister-in-law, Teri, and wife Stacy, all attended UConn. Avid Husky fans, Rob and Stacy reside in Fairfield, CT, and have two sons Noah (23) and Adam (21).

Kevin Kulak began his career as a consultant at Arthur Andersen & Company, now Accenture. Not long after, Kevin decided to pursue an MBA from The Wharton School at the University of Pennsylvania, where he developed a lasting interest in securities and capital markets. After earning his MBA, Kevin joined IBM Credit Corporation where he developed and launched mutual funds before joining Chase Manhattan Bank as an Investment Banking Associate.

For the next two decades, first at JPMorgan Chase and later at UBS, Kevin structured and issued loans, bonds, equities, and derivatives for some of the largest and most influential companies in the United States including IBM, Ford, General Motors, Xerox, and Palantir. Kevin also designed the bond that IBM issued on September 20, 2001, that reopened the U.S. corporate bond market following the attack on the United States on September 11, 2001.

After his investment banking career, Kevin was named a partner at G Squared, a multi-billion-dollar venture capital firm, investing in leading technology companies such as SpaceX, OpenAI, and Anthropic. It was through this work that Kevin found his next role - leading financing activities for Voyager Technologies, a company operating at the intersection of national security, defense, and space.

Today, Kevin focuses much of his time on the construction and financing of Starlab, a commercial space station scheduled to launch into orbit in 2029 aboard a SpaceX Starship rocket. He is the founder of Fizio Health, an AI-driven musculoskeletal care platform serving orthopedic and physical therapy patients. Kevin also serves on the UConn Foundation Board of Directors.

Kevin graduated from UConn in 1985 with a BS in Mechanical Engineering. A life-long resident of Connecticut, Kevin and his wife, Katherine Crews Kulak, reside in Darien, and enjoy spending time in Charlestown, RI. They have four children: Caroline, John, Sam, and Amy, who is a member of the UConn School of Nursing Class of 2029.

While working on his MBA at the UConn School of Business in 1984, Ed Lange began his career in investment banking with Advest, Inc., supporting real estate, health care, and public finance clients. In the early 90's, Ed joined the executive management team at Mediplex, a leading owner/developer of senior housing communities and rehab hospitals. Then, in 1995, Ed joined Health Care REIT as CFO and was a member of the executive team that successfully repositioned the company as a leader in the senior housing finance industry.

In 2000, Ed joined the multifamily owner/operator BRE Properties, Inc. as CFO. He was later promoted to COO and appointed to the company's Board of Directors. While at BRE, Ed led the efforts to reset the company's strategic plan, recapitalize the business, and reorganize its property operations and development program.

After BRE, Ed worked with leading private equity firms, serving in executive roles including CFO and board member at Americold, Inc., and COO and CFO at Healthcare Trust, Inc., to help reposition portfolio companies. During this period, Ed held also independent director roles with two NYSE companies, American Assets Trust, Inc. and STAG Industrial, Inc.

In 2016, Ed joined MAXX Properties, Inc., a privately held multifamily owner/operator, serving as CEO through 2021. At MAXX, Ed developed and implemented a new strategic plan, retooled and enhanced the company's leadership and operations, and positioned the company to partner with institutional investors.

Currently, Ed serves as an adjunct professor at UConn in connection with the Hillside Ventures STEM Fund and is a member of the UConn School of Business Dean's Advisory Cabinet. Through 106 Rio Ventures, Ed engages in entrepreneurial activities in the real estate "prop-tech" space helping founders frame business models and raise seed capital.

Ed earned a BS from the University of Massachusetts in 1981. Ed and his wife, Kim, reside in New Canaan, CT, along with their two children, Maggie (19), a freshman at UConn, and Cooper (17) who attends St. Luke's School. In 2004, after only three years, Emeka Okafor graduated magna cum laude from the UConn School of Business with a degree in finance. A cornerstone of UConn's 2004 NCAA National Championship team, he earned several honors including Final Four Most Outstanding Player, NABC Co-National Player of the Year, 2-time NABC Defensive Player of the Year, Big East Player of the Year, and the 2003 NCAA leader in blocks, becoming one of the most decorated players in program history. His dominance on both ends of the floor led to the second overall selection in the NBA Draft and NBA Rookie of the Year honors.

Over a 10-year career in the NBA, Emeka played for the Charlotte Bobcats, New Orleans Hornets, Washington Wizards, and New Orleans Pelicans, earning a reputation as a dependable, defensive anchor known for shot-blocking, rebounding, and professionalism.

Today, Emeka brings his voice and insight to the game as a men's college basketball analyst often appearing on ESPN, CBS, and Fox Sports.

Off the court, Emeka is known for his philanthropic work focused on education and youth development. In addition to participating in NBA Cares events throughout the year, he also supports two organizations that use basketball as a tool for greater achievements in higher education - Husky Sport, based in Hartford, CT, and New Heights NYC in New York City. These organizations encourage young people to aspire to greatness, arming them with the tools to get there.

Earlier this year, on March 13, Emeka was honored again by becoming the third UConn men's basketball player to have his number retired.

Emeka resides in New York City with his wife, Ilana, and two children, Adaeze and Nnamdi.

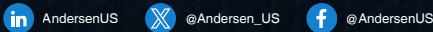
